What is a Medical Home? The Academy of Pediatrics states that a Medical Home is not a building, house or hospital but rather an integrated and trusted partnership to providing health care services in a high quality cost effective manner. The health professionals and parents act as partners in a Medical Home to identify and access the medical and non-medical services needed to help children and their families achieve maximum potential.

Care for your child should be:

Accessible— care is provided in child's community

Coordinated— families are linked to support, educational and community based services

Comprehensive— concern for children and families well being is expressed and demonstrated

Continuous— Health care is available 24 hours a day 7 days a week with preventative and tertiary care needs addressed

Culturally Effective— families cultural background is valued, recognized and respected.

Family Centered— recognition that the family is the primary care giver and the center of strength and support
