- Provides a listing form, enters items, and maintains the database

- Over the Age of 60
- ND Resident

- ActiveF
- Not Living in a Nursing Facility
- Need to be on some type of Assistance
- Priority given to Seniors living in medically underserved rural areas
- Up to \$300 of assistive technology devices for in-home use, consultation and installation if needed at no cost to the consumer.
